**The 30 Hour Early Years Entitlement**

Eligibility

1. Both parents are working (or sole parent is working in a lone parent family) and each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at national living wage and less than £100,000 per year. Working will include self-employed persons. Parents do not necessarily need to actually work 16 hours a week, but rather their earnings must reflect at least 16 hours of work at national living wage. This includes parents on zero hour’s contracts who meet the criteria.
2. Both parents are employed but one or both parents is temporarily away from the workplace on parental, maternity, paternity leave, adoption leave, or statutory sick pay.
3. One parent is employed and one parent has substantial caring responsibilities based on specific benefits received for caring or:
4. One parent is employed and one parent is disabled or incapacitated based on receipt of specific benefits.

It is likely to be that parents will be able to check their eligibility on a government website (yet to be announced) and will be given an eligibility code that they can give to schools to claim their free 30 hours.
