



How to help and support your child to read well



The information below provides a few brief and simple ideas on how you can support your child through their learning journey at home.

Being able to read well is extremely important and is an area of school we prioritise. Reading is how we access our learning and being able to read well opens up opportunities for us to gain new learning independently. This is why we want all of our children to be able to read confidently and fluently, and have great language comprehension. Together, with regular opportunities and consistency, this will happen.

- Make reading a regular activity in your home (parents included!)
- Talk to your children (a lot)
- Read to your children
- Have your children tell you a “story”
- Listen to your child read
- Promote writing
- Ask questions
- Practice phonics – we use the ‘Letters and Sounds’ phonics scheme in our teaching and use the ‘Jolly phonics’ actions to support our teaching.
