





Year 3 will be taught by Miss Wright, supported by Miss Rothwell and Miss Bevan.

<u>English</u>

This term, we will focus on reading and writing an informal letter, an alternative ending to a story, non-chronological reports and character descriptions. Writing will be closely connected to the whole class novels. There will be a strong focus on grammar and punctuation including developing sentence structures while including adverbials of time and expanded noun phrases. Throughout the year, handwriting skills will be taught to continue to develop neatness.

<u>Maths</u>

The main areas for consolidation and extension will be understanding place value, including using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Oral and mental strategies continue to be very important, eg to add 9 to a number, add 10 then subtract 1. Rapid recall of number facts including 10x, 2x, 5x, 4x and the associated division facts will continue. The children will be working with numbers to 1000 and beyond. They will also be applying their knowledge to real-life problem solving.

<u>Science</u>

The first half term we are learning about 'Rocks, Soil and Fossil Formation'. Our second study is 'Light and Shadows' when we will complete investigations about light, shadow and reflections.

<u>RE</u>

The children will be learning about what Christians gain from the creation story and thinking about what kind of world Jesus wanted.

<u>History</u>

The children will begin the year by focusing on studying the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age in History. This will be for the duration of the





full term. The children will be encouraged to learn independently using different resources.

<u>PSHE</u>

Studies this term will focus on 'Me and My Relationships'. The unit will include lessons identifying rules in different locations, looking after our special people, how to solve problems, dares and our special friends.

<u>Music</u>

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Children will learn how music can be used descriptively and how the musical elements can be used and combined to describe different animals. They will create sequences of sound in response to the movements of a chosen animal. Children will be learning about the music of Saint Saens and, in particular, The Carnival of the Animals.

<u>Art</u>

This term children will be using their own sketchbooks focussing on gestural drawings with charcoal. The use of sketchbooks allows for our children to develop their abilities to critically analyse art work and to annotate both their own work and the work of professional artists with increasing confidence, understanding and sophistication.

Computing


The children will be learn aspects of how to keep themselves safe online. After this, the children will learn about connecting computers. By the end of the unit, the children will be able to explain how digital devices function as well as recognise how digital devices can change the way that we work.

<u> PE</u>

Until January, the children will be attending swimming lessons every Tuesday afternoon which will be coached by a fully trained swimming instructor at Heywood Leisure Centre. During their other PE lesson the children will have the opportunity to be coached by a coach from Lancashire Cricket Foundation. During these sessions the children will develop their throwing catching and striking skills.

<u>French</u>

Children will learn basic language which will help them to get to know about another person. This language includes greetings for saying hello and goodbye. By the end of this unit, the children will also be able to ask 'how are you?' and 'What's your name?'.



Children will explore using a 2D shape to create a 3D product. They will research Cath Kidston before designing their own bag and creating their own bag. This unit will develop the sewing skills of the children. Once the children have made their item, they will complete an evaluation.
